

Weather at Palometa Club

The east coast of the Yucatan has a tropical climate, with few temperature differences between seasons, and a pronounced rainy season. The coast is warm year-round, with air temperatures moderated by trade winds off the ocean. Annual rainfall is around 50 in, falling on 115 days per year. More temperate conditions occur from November to February with occasional refreshing northerly breezes. It is drier and becomes warmer in March and April, and the warmest from May to September.



Seasons

The Palometa Club is open each year from January to September. All times of the year can produce amazing fishing for permit, as well as the other flats species of the area. Winter and spring can be the mildest temperatures, but can get windy. This is the primetime for bookings, so plan ahead and book early if you want to get into spring dates. Summer can be amazing fishing for permit, and crowds are usually down from the spring months. It can be hot, but if you are tolerant to the heat, this can be the most productive time of the year for permit. Late summer and spring continue to be amazing permit fishing, and some of the other species can really turn on, such as larger tarpon and snook. It is hurricane season, but the gamble of booking this time of the year can have giant rewards.

Getting to Palometa Club is easy

You'll begin your adventure with a flight to Cancun, Mexico. Cancun is serviced by most every major airline, with direct flights from Houston, Miami, and Dallas. In order to make comfortable connections to the Club, guests must plan their flight reservations to arrive in Cancun no later than 2:00 pm on Friday, and schedule their return flights no earlier than 1:00 pm the following Friday. In Cancun you'll be met by lodge representatives and transferred approximately 3.5 hours south to Punta Allen in a comfortable air-conditioned van.

The Palometa Club operates on a weekly schedule, Friday to Friday.

Why should the Palometa Club be your choice on Ascension Bay?

- Every panga has 2 guides for 2 anglers. One on the poling platform in back and one on the deck with the caster. This doubles the number of professional eyes looking for permit, greatly improving your chances at early fish spotting and opportunities for good shots. The extra guide on the deck with you is also hugely helpful with coaching techniques, relaying information being yelled from the guide on the pole, and line management before and after fish are hooked.
- The Palometa Club uses big 23-foot pangas. This is a giant advantage on the big water crossings of Ascension Bay. The boats are far more comfortable than flats boats in this bigger water, are also very stable when you are up on the nose taking shots at permit. The large boats allow your guides to utilize the entire bay, instead of being isolated to the north or south shore as the lodges using flats boats are.
- The beachfront Lodge accommodations are super inviting and comfortable and the perfect setting for a flats fishing lodge. Right on the water in Punta Allen, the guide's pangas pull up to within 50 feet of the lodge's backdoor, and the closest flats to cast at permit are only a 10-minute run. There is no better possible location to access the entire bay and the Boca Paia Lagoon.
- The American Lodge managers Dick and Kaye alongside Mike and Maureen Gifford run this operation seamlessly. Their staff is super professional and English speaking, making the level of service at the Palometa Club second to none on Ascension Bay.
- This area of Mexico has some of the world's finest permit angling and the Palometa Club has strived to become the most elite permit-oriented lodge out there. The guides live and breathe permit, that is all they think about. You can choose to look for the other species in the Grand Slam, but if you are a permit Junky, this is your place... And the permit can be enormous here!
